Information for members: please read and keep this section (pages 2-3)

The aim of Derrybeg Farm is to integrate community and agriculture in a mixed, biodiverse, sustainable and environmentally responsible farm, managed for the benefit of everyone involved. The farm can thrive by having direct commitment from local supporters. We hope to develop a rich diversity of livestock, crops and wildlife that will change and develop with the opportunities and interests of the support community and those who work the land. The support community is made up of people who commit to the farm aims. The community organises activities to provide enjoyment and understanding of food and farming for its members, to develop their connection to the life of the earth and their sense of responsibility to and involvement in the farm enterprise.

Membership categories commencing March 2019 for 12 months:

Weekly box sufficient for 4-6 people: €860 full fee = €71.66 per month for 12 months = €16.54 per week.

Weekly box sufficient for 2-4 people: €660 full fee = €55 per month for 12 months = €12.69 per week.

Weekly box sufficient for 1 person: €460 full fee = €38.33 per month for 12 months = €8.85 per week.

Social membership for a household: €30 annual fee.

Fees can be paid in full or in monthly instalments, for all food memberships. It is not possible to pay in weekly instalments. Social membership must be paid in full.

Our ethos and values

- Achieve a financial situation where low income shall not exclude anyone.
- Work co-operatively with other enterprises that share our principles.

What is in a food box?

A box will contain a variety of produce for the twelve months. In the winter we'll have a supply of winter salads including lettuce as well as standing crops such as cabbage, kale, leek, parsnips and Jerusalem artichoke, also potatoes, beetroot, celeriac, butternut squash and carrots from store. In spring it will be mostly fresh salad leaves such as loose leaf lettuce, rocket and oriental greens. As the year progresses we will start to produce peas, spring onions, spinach, radishes, white turnip and baby carrots. Coming into summer we'll start to have tomatoes, courgettes, cucumber, melon, french beans, beetroots, carrots, fennel and salad potatoes. All of these will continue through autumn with late additions including broccoli and squashes.

Please note that some of this harvest may not be available; it depends on the weather and other conditions. Membership of the farm involves sharing the risk of a poor harvest with the farmer and the other members.

Collecting your food

Produce will be harvested on Fridays and members will be alerted by text when the bags are ready for collection.

Your bags will be available for collection from the shipping container at the farm in Mooretown (opposite the Salesian college).

Ideally you should collect your bag as soon as possible as salads etc. will begin to wilt as they are not refrigerated. Food that has not been collected by Thursday will be put into the shared box for common collection.

We encourage members to collect vegetables for each other in order to minimise travel. To make this easier to organise and to help build a community around the farm we encourage members to share their contact details. If a critical number of members come from a specific town they can arrange a common pick-up point. The farmers or volunteer members could drop off the bags to this point.

Member involvement

Everyone is welcome to visit the farm at any time, participate in our management and planning work groups, join in our celebrations and come to the Farm Days. Derrybeg Farm also welcomes people who would like to join the community purely for the social benefits. As the project succeeds we hope that the ways of working will expand to other farms and enterprises so that more people can get involved in this way of farming.

Bursary scheme

If you feel that the fees are too much, then please contact Liam O'Toole on 085-7117358 or email the membership coordinator, Clare Lee, at membership@derrybegfarm.ie. We have a bursary scheme to assist members on a low income. It may also be possible to arrange some work-share memberships if you have skills that are of value to the farm. We would need to discuss this in detail with you as this scheme is only in its infancy.

Regular monthly payments

Since the farm needs support throughout the year, monthly payments need to continue even if you are on holiday. You can arrange for a friend to collect and use your vegetables when you are away. If nobody can collect them for you, please phone or text Aisling, our farmer, at 086-1228822, so that the excess can be distributed among the other members. If you decide to stop your standing order then you may need to join a waiting list before you can rejoin. Derrybeg Farm needs three months' notice for cancellation of a Food Share. This ensures that the farm is supported and gives us time to recruit someone to take your place.
